

The seminar will examine from a critical perspective, the new types of information that digital technology affords for our field. Techniques such as photogrammetry and data visualizations, to name just two, are, after all, interpretative frameworks with advantages as well as limitations. At the same time, these new tools allow for an exponentially broader and microscopically more focused view of things than has ever been possible in our practice. The seminar will explore the opportunities and consider the effects of such research technologies, in part through current research projects that involve them.
