

Lower Relief



The lower register depicts Tekerwesir sitting on a lion legged couch with his wife, Hepu, and Mutuankh ('the justified', indicating that she may be dead), his mother. The man is identified as the "sculptor of (the god) Mont, the powerful [one]". The women are chain embracing the man, showing their support for him. Two women depicted on a stele with a man in front of his offering table is rare. They are seated in front of an offering table (which contains water/wine jugs and a goose) insinuating that this man is also dead. Under Investigation:

The other side of the table shows Tekerwesir's daughter, Hepu, and Senet whose relationship is still a mystery.
