Dr. Natalie Diaz

Natalie Diaz is a poet, a MacArthur Fellow, and an associate professor of English at Arizona State University. She grew up on the Fort Mojave Indian Reservation and is an enrolled member of the Gila River Indian Tribe. At ASU, she launched the Center for Imagination in the Borderlands. Her first collection of poems, *When My Brother Was an Aztec*, won the American Book Award in 2012. Her second collection, *Postcolonial Love Poem*, won the Pulitzer in 2021 and was a finalist for both the National Book Award and the Forward Prize in Poetry.



Dr. Jackie Wang

Jackie Wang is an Assistant Professor of American Studies and Ethnicity at the University of Southern California. She is the author of *Carceral Capitalism* (Semiotext(e) Press, 2018) and co-author, with the University of Michigan's Precarity Lab, of *Technoprecarious* (Goldsmith Press, 2020), which examines how digital technologies exacerbate gendered and racialized forms of social precarity. In addition to her scholarship, she is a poet whose collection, *The Sunflower Cast a Spell to Save Us From the Void* (Nightboat, 2021), was a finalist for a National Book Award.
