USC Career Pathways Summer Internship Stipends defray costs for qualified undergraduate students at USC Dornsife to participate in summer internships. Students secure their own internship for the summer and apply for funding. Students may be considered for stipends ranging from \$1,000 to \$3,500 USD dollars. Internship stipends may be used to offset costs including but not limited to: expenses related to unpaid internships, living-out-of permanent address costs, housing costs, food costs, public transportation, airfare, and other incidental costs and expenses related to an internship.
