Application is first-come, first-selected basis

LexPreLaw uses a cohort-based model of engaging and observing participants. In 2023, LexPreLaw will enroll 125 aspiring lawyers who already possess or will obtain a bachelor's degree by August 2024 and who plan to seek law school admission for the Fall 2024 entering class.

All LexPreLaw participants will benefit from LSAT prep and financial assistance during the program. Participants will also have access to financial education, law school informational resources, and opportunities to engage with current law students and legal professionals.
