## **Funding Opportunities**

#### FOREIGN LANGUAGE AND AREA STUDIES (FLAS) FELLOWSHIP

For undergraduate and graduate students | Deadline: Friday, February 9, 2018

FLAS fellowships are awarded to EASC by a U.S. Department of Education Title VI grant for undergraduate and graduate study of Mandarin Chinese, Japanese or Korean and East Asian area studies. The purpose of the program is to enrich the nation's pool of area and international specialists. Summer 2018 awards for intensive modern language programs will be \$7,500. Academic Year 2018-2019 awards for study at USC, abroad, or both will be \$15,000 for undergraduate students and \$23,000 for graduate students, contingent on continued funding from the U.S. Department of Education Title VI program.

The Association for Japan-U.S. Community Exchange (ACE) - Nikaido Fellowship provides stipends of up to \$5,000 to awarded graduate students, depending on the proposed course of study. The purpose of the award is to advance understanding of Japan and/or US-Japan relations. Most awards are given in smaller increments based on proposed project. The award may be used for research, Japanese language training or Japanese area studies.
