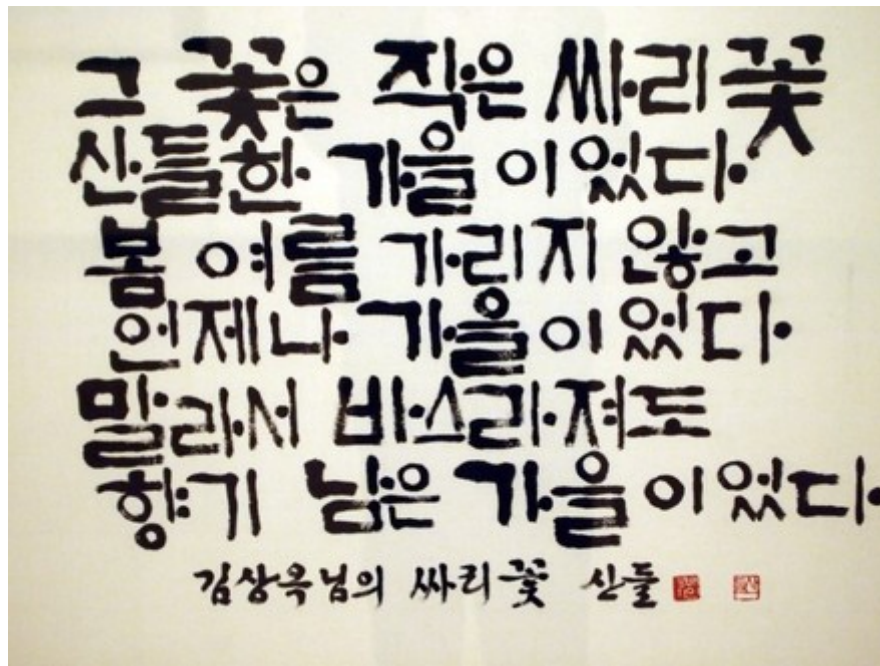

Beginning in 2001, the USC Korean Language and Culture Project (KLCP), headed by Professor Namkil Kim, has hosted an annual Korean Teachers Training Workshop (KTTW) as part of an ongoing effort to increase interest in the teaching and learning of Korean in the United States. Sponsored by the USC East Asian Studies Center, the workshop is designed with the specific goals of providing effective teaching skills and encouraging teachers to develop a variety of teaching materials for their Korean classes.

This year, in addition to the 15th Annual KTTW, the USC KLCP will also be hosting the 1st USC-Yonsei University Joint Symposium, which will feature presentations from scholars working on research in language education and applied linguistics. Both events will be held back-to-back on Saturday, February 14 on the USC campus.
