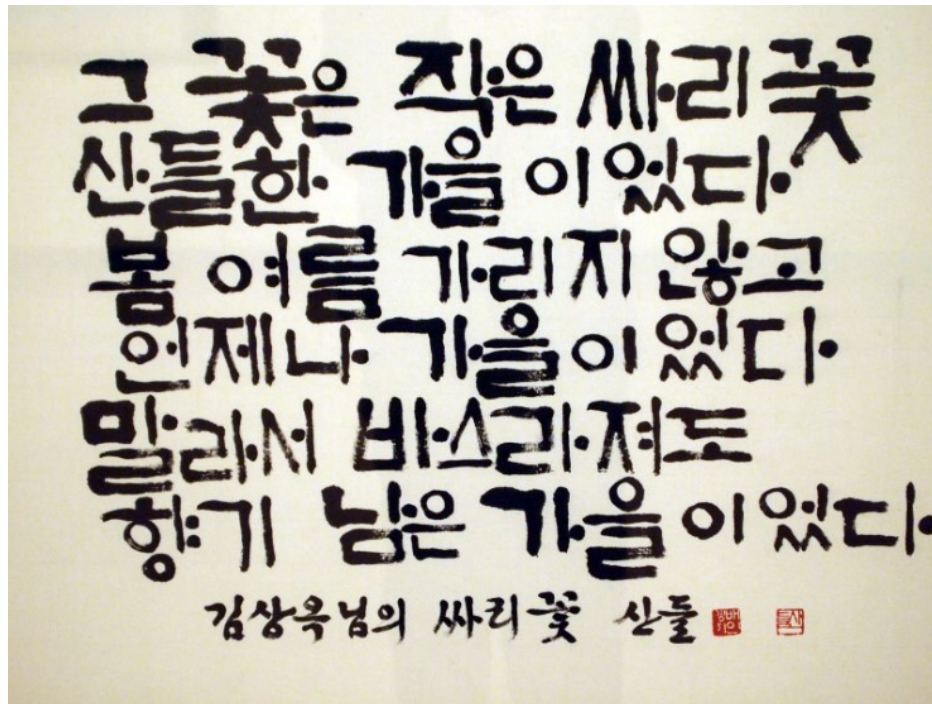

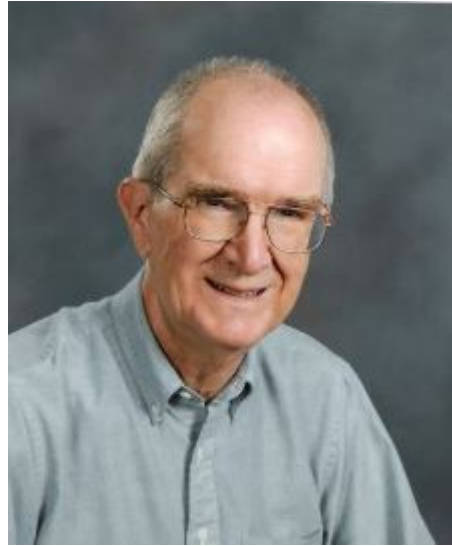
**Upcoming Event: USC-Yonsei Joint Symposium & Korean Teachers Training Workshop**
