Dunhuang Research Academy (DHRA) is a national Chinese institution responsible for the conservation, management and research of several cultural heritage sites, including the Mogao Grottoes, a world cultural heritage site in Dunhuang. EASC director Professor Brett Sheehan and discussed the role that our Center plays at USC and the mission and work of the Dunhuang Research Academy.
