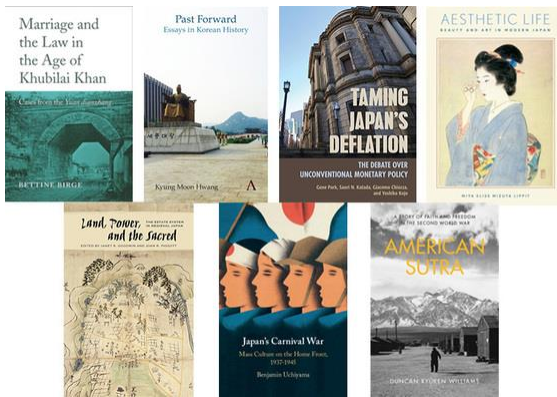
### Commemorating the Centennial: Spring 1919, the Korean Independence Movement, and the Digitized Archive

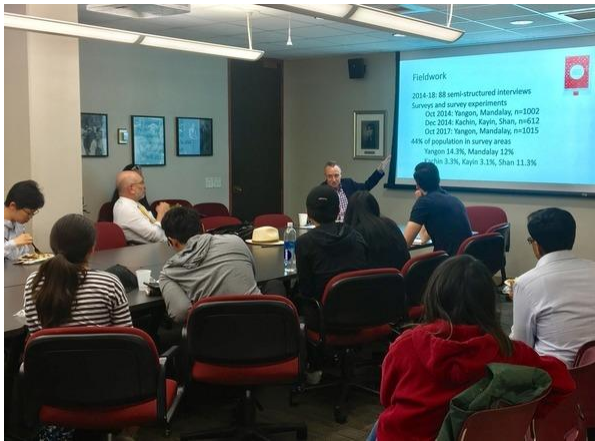

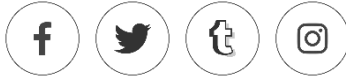
