

## Postdoc Scholar-Teaching Fellow in EASC

EASC invites applications for a one-year post-doctoral fellowship in East Asian Studies for **AY 2020-21**. Researchers with training in East Asian culture, film, literature, art history, visual culture and media studies, history, politics and international relations, sociology, anthropology, economics, and religion are particularly welcome to apply. In addition to research, the successful candidate is expected to teach 3 courses per academic year, EASC 150 *East Asian* 

Societies and EASC 592 Proseminar on East Asia in Fall 2020 and EASC 160 China and the World in Spring 2021, and to participate in the intellectual life of the Center and other units on campus.
