documentary features the history of Jeronimo Lim Kim who was born in 1926 to Korean indentured servant parents in Cuba. He joins the Cuban revolution and crosses paths with Fidel Castro and Che Guevara until he rediscovers his ethnic roots and dedicates his later life to reconstructing his Korean Cuban identity. The screening will be followed by a Q&A with the director, **Joseph Juhn**.
