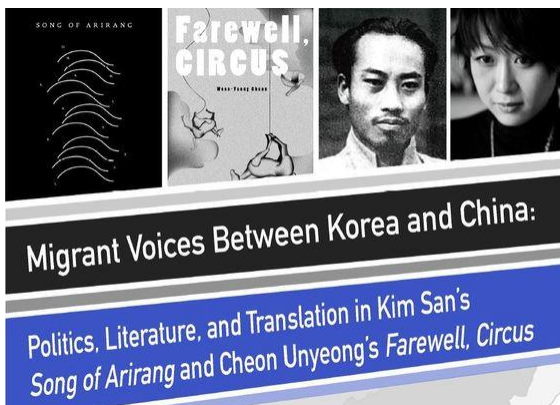
EASC at Study Abroad Fair
