### Global East Asia Scholars Explore, Learn

This summer, EASC sent 41 undergraduate students to live, study and travel in Shanghai, Tokyo and Seoul on the Global East Asia scholarship study abroad program. This is the largest cohort of scholars since the program began in 2009, spanning 26 different majors and seven schools at USC. Made possible by a generous grant from the Freeman Foundation, Global East Asia gives students the opportunity to study abroad in China, Japan or Korea for four weeks with a scholarship that covers airfare, housing, meals and more. >Read Full Article
