## EASC Fellow Alumni Feature: Billy Noiman

**Billy Noiman** graduated from USC with a double major in Business Administration and East Asian Languages and Cultures in 2010. While at USC, he received the **EASC Area Studies Abroad (ASA) Fellowship**, funded by a generous grant from the Freeman Foundation, to study abroad in Beijing, China.
