Event: Five Features of Korean Three Kingdoms Period Architecture & How They Relate to China

This talk by **Nancy S. Steinhardt**, Professor of East Asian Art at the University of Pennsylvania, explores six structures or structural types that dominate Korean architecture in the fifth and sixth centuries: brick layering in Paekche tombs, octagonal buildings in Koguryō and Silla, the inter-relationship temples and tombs, twin structures in Koguryō and Silla, and octagonal ceilings in Koguryo tombs. Relying on the most recent archaeological evidence, the talk investigates the geographic extent of each form in one of the Korean kingdoms, across kingdoms, and in China and Japan. The conclusion will address the legacy of Three Kingdoms-period architecture in Northeast Asia in the eleventh century.
