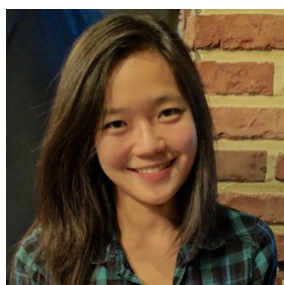
### EASC Manuscript Review for Jenny Chio

**Application Guidelines | Deadline: June 30**

The [Taiwan Fellowship](#) is established by the **Ministry of Foreign Affairs** (MOFA) to award foreign experts and scholars interested in research related to Taiwan, cross-strait relations, the Asia-Pacific region, and Sinology to conduct advanced research at universities or academic institutions in Taiwan. Recipients will receive monthly grants up to NT\$60,000 and the award period ranges from three to twelve months. Professors, associate professors, assistant professors, post-doctoral researchers, doctoral candidates, and research fellows are invited to [apply](#).
