Full-Time Teaching-Track Faculty Position in East Asian Cultural Studies

The [Department of East Asian Languages and Cultures](#) and the [East Asian Studies Center](#) invite applications for a [full-time teaching-track faculty position](#) in East Asian cultural studies at USC, with a preferred focus on China and its interregional connections.

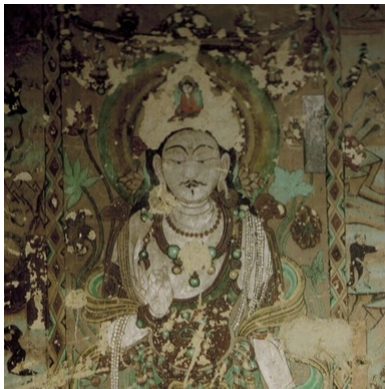


The successful applicant will teach five courses per year, including two large general education courses for the East Asian Studies Center and three upper-division undergraduate courses in East Asian Languages and Cultures. The new hire is also expected to serve on thesis committees of students enrolled in the East Asian Area Studies M.A. program. The position will begin **August 2023** and is renewable after the initial three-year term.

The [application](#) must include a curriculum vitae, a cover letter that includes a statement of teaching interests, one writing sample (either a published journal article or a dissertation chapter), recent teaching evaluations, and the names of three individuals who will be contacted by USC for a letter of reference. At least two of the referees should speak to teaching abilities. **Review of applications is to begin on May 1, 2023.**

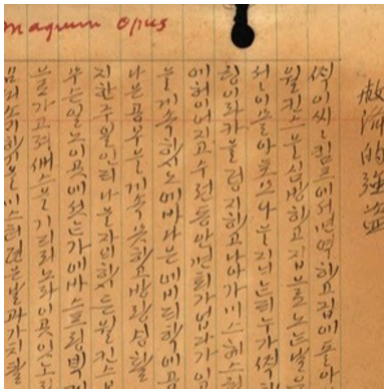

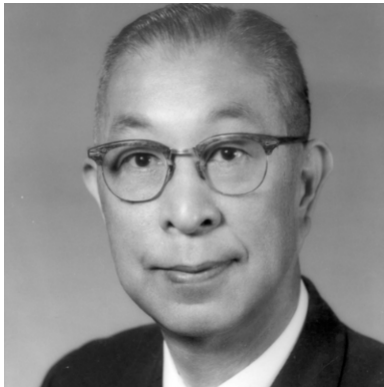
