2-unit repeatable course offered Fall 2022 and Spring 2023 (up to 6 units) FLYER

This practicum workshop, taught by Prof. **Miya Desjardins**, allows students to explore the entirety of the publication process of *Review of Japanese Culture and Society*, an established peer-reviewed academic journal with a 30-year history, published by the University of Hawai'i Press. The theme of the 2022-2023 issue is "Empires in Motion, Cultures of Crossing."

This class will also examine the traditional boundaries of the notion of "translation" and its methodologies in the context of publishing, editing,

marketing and communication, and design. The workshop format encourages collaboration between students with different fields of interest, within Dornsife as well as other schools at USC such as Roski and Marshall, and with scholars and graduate students in Japan and other parts of the world.
