department unit. The successful applicant will be responsible for acquisition tasks including purchasing electronic and print monographs and receiving physical resources. Duties will also include acting on purchase requests, including those submitted via the Libraries' Recommend a Purchase form. Tenure-Track Position - Professor of Japanese

The Department of Asian Studies at Furman University invites applications for a tenure-track position at the rank of assistant, associate, or professor of Japanese to begin August 2024. The position consists primarily in teaching Japanese language. Applicants with expertise in the fields of



contemporary Japanese culture and society, including but not limited to film or performing arts, literature, gender and sexuality, or race and ethnicity are encouraged to apply. The teaching load is five courses per year, which will include language classes at all levels. Responsibilities also include developing courses in the candidate's area of specialty, coordinating study abroad; involvement in cocurricular activities; teaching first-year seminars; offering interdisciplinary courses on Asian Studies; pursuing an active research agenda; advising and mentoring; and university service. Qualifications include a Ph.D. in Japanese or a related field expected and Native language proficiency or near-native language proficiency in Japanese and English is required.
