Reunion: Mei Lan-Fang and the United States

Friday, September 13 | 11:00AM - 12:00PM | DML 240 | FLYER

Mei Lan-Fang (October 22nd, 1894—August 8th, 1961) was an internationally renowned Peking Opera artist of the 20th century, admired and loved by people in China and beyond. 2024 marks the 130th anniversary of Mei's birth, and the 95th anniversary of his visit to the United States. During his visit to the U.S. in 1930, Mei received an honorary doctorate from USC. To celebrate this important event, the **USC East Asian Library** will host an exhibition throughout the fall semester showcasing Mei's life achievements. A special event cohosted by the Chinese National Academy of Arts, featuring a look at Mei's life, and a short performance by the China National Peking Opera Company will take place on Friday, September 13 in the Doheny Memorial Library (DML 240). *This event is by invitation only.*

This exhibit is organized by the **Chinese National Academy of Arts** and co-sponsored by the **Library of Chinese National Academy of Arts, USC Libraries, US-China Institute, Center on Public Diplomacy, East Asian Studies Center, China National Peking Opera Company, Mei Lanfang Memorial Museum,** and the **Taizhou Municipal People's Government.**

Jaden Stovall

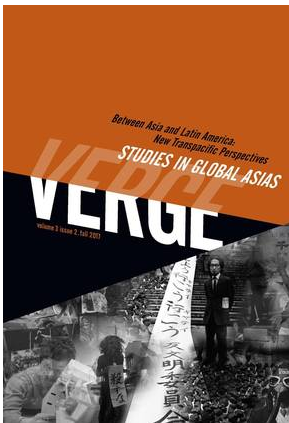
