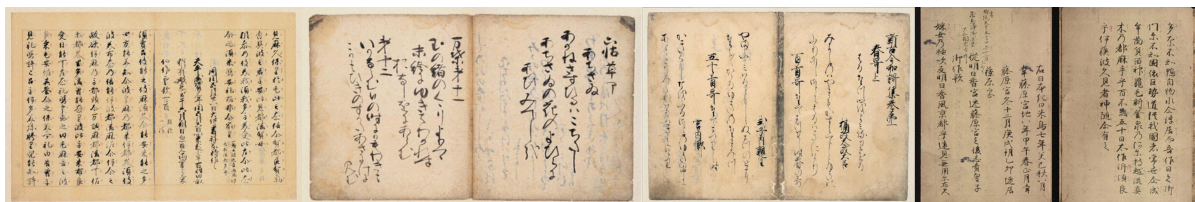

associated with the ideal of the sovereign as maker of the world through the Man'yōshū text (Collection of a Myriad Ages).

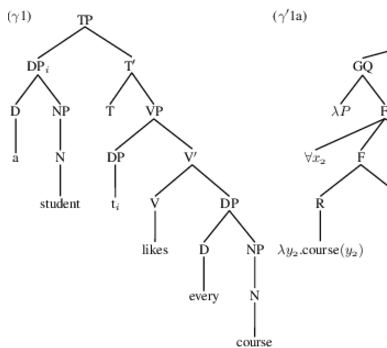
