At the Edge of Empire: A Family's Reckoning with China Wednesday, October 16, 2024 | 12:00PM-1:00PM | ASC 207 | RSVP

Join us for a book talk by **Edward Wong** (*The New York Times*). The son of Chinese immigrants in Washington, DC, Edward Wong grew up among family secrets. His father toiled in Chinese restaurants and rarely spoke of his native land or his years in the People's Liberation Army under Mao. When Edward Wong became the Beijing bureau chief for *The New York Times*, he investigated his father's mysterious past while assessing for himself the dream of a resurgent China. Following in his father's footsteps, he witnessed ethnic struggles in Xinjiang and Tibet and pro-democracy protests in Hong Kong. Wong tells a moving chronicle of a family and a nation that spans decades of momentous change and gives profound insight into a new authoritarian age transforming the world.

Center for East Asian Garden Studies Fellowship

June and Simon K.C. Li Fellowship in East Asian Garden and Landscape Studies supports research in East Asian garden and landscape studies by scholars at any stage of career. Fellows will spend three to twelve months in residence at The Huntington between July 1, 2025, and June 30, 2026, where they will engage in research and participate in public programs. The fellowship provides a stipend of up to \$50,000, depending on the length of the

award.

Eligibility: Scholars at any stage of their career from ABD onward.

To apply: Send a project description, a description of Huntington collections to consult, and a work plan, along with a 1-page project bibliography and a c.v. to fellowships@huntington.org. Please arrange for two letters of recommendation to be sent to this address as well. All materials must be received by **December 1, 2024**, and award notifications will be made in February 2025.


