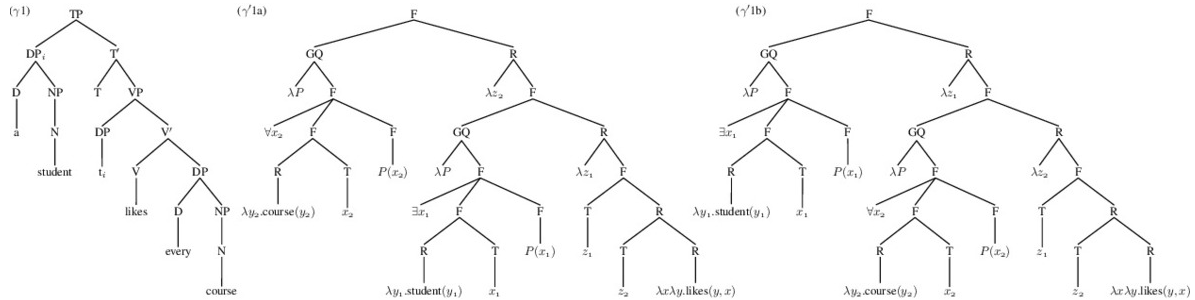

EASC Guest Speaker Series: Synchronizing Structure and Meaning Using Tree Adjoining Grammar - Chung-hye Han

Prof. Stephanie Shih invites the wider community to a talk by **Prof. Chung-hye Han** (Simon Fraser University). Prof. Han's work explores the many aspects of complexity related to natural language, through the lens of Korean, English, and beyond. Prof. Han's work often implements methodologies from a wide range of disciplines (e.g. linguistics, computer science, and psychology) to explore the complexity of human language. This talk uses computational methods to uncover what can be learned about particular types of complex linguistic structures.
