# A Sound from Endless Desert: A Conversation with Abduweli Ayup and Screening of *Behind the Mask*

Please join us for a talk, film screening and post-screening Q&A with director **Abduweli Ayup** and Faculty Moderator, **Prof. Travis Major** (Linguistics). Abduweli Ayup, an Uyghur scholar and activist, will give a presentation about the Uyghur people and the current crisis they face. This will be followed by a screening of the documentary *Behind the Mask*, which is centered on his experiences as a survivor of a Uyghur internment camp and subsequent opportunity to confront a former guard from his camp; however, he must consider the effect on his children, who witnessed his arrest. The documentary will be followed by a Q&A.




