USC Japanese Language Program TA-ship

The Department of East Asian Languages and Cultures is looking for a graduate student (master, doctoral) to fill the position of Program TA in the Japanese

Language Program for Spring 2025. The Teaching Assistantship is a 50% appointment that provides a stipend of \$20,000.00 and tuition remission up to 12 approved units at the Dornsife tuition rate, payment of the mandatory Student Health Center fee and USC graduate student health and dental insurance premiums for the Spring semester of 2025. The appointment also provides payment of the orientation fee, student programming fee, Norman H. Topping Student Aid Fund fee and



transportation fee. The primary responsibility of the Program TA is to assist faculty with grading, course material preparation, website content management, and providing conversation practices for students of Japanese courses. The preference will be given to the candidate with strong communication skills in both English and Japanese, computer skills, and interest in cross-cultural communication and education. The position is renewable based on performance.

This Spring 2025 appointment begins January 1, 2025 and continues through May 15, 2025 contingent on satisfactory performance. This is a 50% appointment, which means that you are expected to devote, on average, 15-20 hours per week to your duties as a TA.
