China's Domestic Politics Beyond Water's Edge: BRI
and China's Fragmented Foreign Policy

Prof. Stanley Rosen invites the wider community to an event with Prof. Andrew
Mertha (Johns Hopkins University) to discuss the complexities of China's Belt and
Road Initiative and what it reveals about the country's global ambitions. China's Belt
and Road Initiative (BRI) is often seen as a unified strategy to expand the country's
global influence. In this talk, Prof. Mertha challenges that view by showing how
China's fragmented and decentralized domestic politics shape, and at times
complicate, its foreign policy and soft power ambitions. Using case studies from
Nicaragua, Myanmar, Ghana, and Cambodia, he highlights how local political
dynamics within China spill across borders, reshaping the impact of the BRI and
raising new questions about the nature of China's rise.
