# **GEA Tokyo Spotlight - Mariana Hernandez**

Mariana Hernandez is currently a senior majoring in GeoDesign. This summer, through the Global East Asia Maymester, she explored greenspace accessibility in Tokyo, focusing on how small parks, temple grounds, tree-lined streets, and even incidental greenery shape the city's livability. She found that these spaces, while often subtle, are deeply woven into daily life—serving not only ecological functions but also reflecting cultural



values of beauty, care, and accessibility. From observing wedding photos at Meiji Jingu to pausing at a local shrine grove, Mariana discovered how Tokyo's green design fosters community and well-being in unexpected ways. She credits the Maymester program's walking tours, lectures, and immersive site visits for helping her connect lived experiences with broader themes in urban design and Japanese history! The International Research Center for Japanese Studies (Nichibunken) is accepting recommendations for the FY2026 Nichibunken Academic Encouragement Award, which supports junior scholars outside Japan who advance the internationalization of Japanese Studies. Eligible candidates



are doctoral students from institutions with Nichibunken exchange agreements or full members of the Consortium for Global Japanese Studies; applicants must be enrolled in a doctoral program at the time of application and able to conduct research in Japan. The award covers airfare, accommodation, per diem allowances, provides access to Nichibunken's research facilities and library, offers faculty mentorship, and includes visa assistance. **Learn more here**
