The Next Wave of Chinese Science Fiction: Toward a **Neo-Baroque Literary Universe**

Prof. Brian Bernards and Prof. Sunyoung Park invite the wider community to a talk by Prof. Mingwei Song (Wellesley College) on Chinese science fiction with moderation by Prof. Bernards and PhD candidate **Seoyeon Lee**. In recent years, the Chinese SF world has seen the emergence of a new generation of writers, mostly women, who have developed their distinct literary voices amid the collapse of the new liberal world order, the backlash against a free-market-oriented "universal" version of globalization, and the rises of a series of worldwide social and cultural movements, such as the #Me Too Movement, and the Gen Z environmentalist activism. Also important for them is a new rally call for establishing a planetary consciousness, which implies a new vision of multiplicity and diversity, in which we cohabit with other species. All these themes, together with less darker visions of technology and a new hope for creating a technologized future of the coexistence between the human and the posthuman, have characterized the politics of "She-




