




FRESNO BHC SITE BOUNDARIES





Population by Race/Ethnicity 1990 to 2005-2009





Population by Race/Ethnicity 2005-2009





Proportion of People of Color 1990 to 2005-2009






Percent of Households that are Linguistically Isolated 1990 to 2005-2009




Population by Immigration Status 2005-2009





Population by Non-Foreign Born and Citizenship of Foreign Born 2005-2009





Proportion of Immigrants 1990 to 2005-2009





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
Country/Region of Origin for Immigrants 2000 & 2005-2009



Age by Sex, Fresno BHC Site, 2005-09





Age Distribution by Race/Ethnicity 2005-2009





Dependency Ratio* 1990 to 2005-2009





Youth by Race/Ethnicity* 2005-2009








Percent of Youth in Poverty by Age Group* 2005-2009



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

Percent of Population Below 150 Percent Federal Poverty Line (FPL)* 1990 to 2005-2009





Median Household Income 1990 to 2005-2009





Average Per Capita Income 1990 to 2005-2009





Percent Poverty by Race/Ethnicity 2000 & 2005-2009





Educational Attainment by Race/Ethnicity 2005-2009





Employment Status by Race/Ethnicity 2005-2009







Housing Tenure 1990, 2000 & 2005-2009





Health Profile

Understanding the health of your community can start with understanding the numbers. How many children have access to a safe park? How many adults have health insurance? To answer these questions, hundreds of residents in Central/Southeast/Southwest Fresno participated in the California Health Interview Survey (CHIS). The survey was conducted to support Building Healthy Communities (BHC), a 10-year plan of The California Endowment (TCE) to help 14 communities develop into places where children are healthy, safe, and ready to learn

This Health Profile describes the health of adults, teens, and children living in Central/Southeast/Southwest Fresno, one of the 14 BHC sites. It provides a snapshot of key survey findings prior to implementing the BHC plan and can be used to mobilize friends and neighbors, advocate for community change, secure greater resources, and guide community planning. Selected Highlights

 Adults in Fresno BHC site are nearly twice as likely to be obese (39%) as adults in the state (21%).

- Parents of children under age 18 in Fresno BHC site are less likely to report that their neighbors get along, can be trusted, and are willing to help each other compared their statewide counterparts.
- Only half of children age 2-17 in Fresno BHC site reported having visited a dentist compared to over 85% of children in Fresno county and the California.
- Adults in the Fresno BHC site were three times less likely to go to the emergency department last year than their county and state counterparts.












