## Health Profile

Understanding the health of your community can start with understanding the numbers. How many children have access to a safe park? How many adults have health insurance? To answer these questions, hundreds of residents in Southwest/East Merced participated in the California Health Interview Survey (CHIS). The survey was conducted to support Building Healthy Communities (BHC), a 10 -year plan of The California Endowment (TCE) to help 14 communities develop into places where children are healthy, safe, and ready to learn.

This Health Profile describes the health of adults, teens, and children living in Southwest/East Merced, one of the 14 BHC sites. It provides a snapshot of key survey findings prior to implementing the BHC plan and can be used to mobilize friends and neighbors, advocate for community change, secure greater resources, and guide community planning. - $33 \%$ of adults are uninsured versus $27 \%$ in Merced County \& 22\%* in CA
- $34 \%$ of adults are insured by private coverage / employer versus 52\%* in Merced County \& 61\%* in CA
- $9 \%$ of children are uninsured versus 5\% in Merced County \& CA
