Policy Statement JDEA "Short Notes"

August 27, 2009

• What is acceptable?

- 1. Comments on published papers,
 - (a) Counterexample or correction of a published result,
 - (b) Shorter proof or one which takes advantage of other results,
 - (c) Additional citations overlooked in an article,
 - (d) Small but noteworthy generalizations,
 - (e) Significant application or example relevant to previous publication of submitting author
- 2. A very interesting example: One that appears to have "watershed" potential,
- 3. Announcement of results: Considered only if a copy of the accepted manuscript together with evidence of acceptance is submitted along with the Note.

• Implementation:

- 1. The title of each Note shall begin with "A Note on ...",
- 2. Page limit: Four pages including references, when using the JDEA class file without altering margins or other spacing commands. The Journal class files are downloadable at http://www.tandf.co.uk/journals/authors/gdeaauth.asp. Follow the link to "LaTeX Template" in Section 2. Style guidelines,
- 3. References should be made only to published articles or accepted manuscripts. In the latter case a copy of the manuscript together with evidence of acceptance must be submitted along with the Note,
- 4. All published Notes shall be referred,
- 5. All Notes should be submitted on line at http://mc.manuscriptcentral.com/gdea,
- 6. A maximum of 2 accepted Notes within a 12 month period will be considered for publication.
