I wish Lototsky worked on the basic concepts of a chapter and explained the motivation for each concept before diving into complicated theorems and proofs. It felt like I was taking a reading a textbook on my own and attending a special topics lecture instead of a fully fledged mathematical statistics course.





# STUDENT ENGAGEMENT ANALYSIS


#### Number of Instructor Interactions Outside of Class
