VISS 599: Art & Science in the Gallery

Daniela BleichmarWednesdays2-4:50pmTHH 308In the Fall of 2024, cultural institutions throughout Southern California will host more
than sixty simultaneous exhibitions exploring connections between art and science past,
present, and future as part of "PST: Art and Science Collide." Led by the Getty Foundation,
PST is one of the most expansive art events in the world.

Seizing the opportunity presented by this curatorial extravaganza, this graduate seminar will examine select examples of the relationship between art and science in a variety of historical moments and cultural contexts. Each week we will visit and analyze one or more exhibitions, often meeting with scholars and museum professionals. We will read and discuss texts from fields including visual studies, history of science, science studies, art history, history, anthropology, and museum studies. Students will also attend special events and programs.

Students will develop a final research project that advances their own scholarly agenda and entails visits to additional exhibitions.
